



## Code of Conduct / Set of Rules for Young People

**Sale Cricket Club** is fully committed to safeguarding and promoting the wellbeing of all its members.

**Sale Cricket Club** believes that it is important that members, coaches, administrators and parents, carers or guardians associated with the club should, at all times, show respect and understanding for the safety and welfare of others.

Therefore, members are encouraged to be open at all times and to share any concerns or complaints that they may have about any aspect of the club with the Club Secretary or Club Welfare Officer.

As a member of **Sale Cricket Club** you are expected to abide by the following junior code of conduct:

- All members must play within the rules and respect officials and their decisions. Any display of dissent will invite sanctions from club officials.
- All members must respect the rights, dignity and worth of all participants regardless of gender, ability, cultural background or religion.
- Members should keep to agreed timings for training and competitions or inform their coach or team manager if they are going to be late.
- Members must wear suitable kit – preferably whites and suitable trainers or cricket shoes for matches and appropriate training kit and footwear for training sessions, as agreed with the coach/team manager. In hardball

games, all players under the age of 18 years must wear helmets when batting and when standing up to the stumps when wicket keeping.

- Members must pay any fees promptly.
- Junior members are not allowed to smoke on club premises or whilst representing the club at competitions.
- Junior members are not allowed to consume alcohol or drugs of any kind on the club premises or whilst representing the club.
